HURLING YOURSELF OFF a cliff into a warm body of water is a longtime tradition for Bermudians and a must-do for tourists. Why not take the leap yourself?


The Caribbean island is full of sweeping limestone cliffs. Make your way to Diving Board Island, which is just a short


boat ride from the capital city of Hamilton. Guests can choose from several different heights, so newbies can take baby steps.

FLORIDA'S EVERGLADES NATIONAL Park, the largest subtropical wilderness in the continental U.S., is the only place in the world where you can see toothy crocodiles and alligators living side by side in the wild. Seek them out by racing among the sawgrass and cattails on an airboat tour.

Boats can reach speeds up to 50 mph or travel at a more relaxing pace that lets guests take in the scenery. Prolong your visit by checking out animal exhibits back on land that let you hold a baby gator or feed a pot-bellied pig. Or kick it up a notch with a nighttime tour. You'll hear the hum of crickets and frogs while being watched by red-glowing gator eyes. >>>

THERE'S NOTHING LIKE careening down the side of an active volcano, especially while ash is flying to and fro and the hot wind is tousling your hair.

Cerro Negro, which first appeared in western Nicaragua near the town of Leon in 1850, has erupted more than 20 times over the years and is known as the youngest, most active volcano in the hemisphere.

The steep, 45-minute climb to the top of the volcano leads to unparalleled views. But the real fun starts on the way down. Guests slide down the outer, ashy rim of the volcano on a sled-like contraption that's just plain fun to ride. Better yet, bragging rights are a guarantee.
